

An official with the Government Accountability Board says it's illegal to vote where a person is just temporarily located. So did a Madison woman who claims she voted in Onalaska last November break the law? The Dane County D.A. just got the case from Lacrosse County and will look into it now.

A legislative aide, who worked for a state Assembly candidate near Onalaska, says she made it clear on her Facebook, that her stay in Onalaska last November was temporary, and she should have voted in Madison. In an Onalaska police report, the aide she said was told by a poll worker it would be okay to vote there – and she didn't mean to do anything wrong.

A Dane County supervisor wrote a blog entry that challenged the aide's right to vote in Onalaska. A Madison man read it, and then filed a complaint.
