

Minnesota outlawed synthetic drugs back on July 1st.....seems as one Winona store owner was not happy with that as he kept on selling it. Winona Police say the amount of synthetic marijuana seized Friday at a Winona tobacco shop totaled 1,066 bags of varying sizes and weights.

Officers from 4 agencies raided Royal Tobacco after undercover officers made purchases of the banned substances over the past couple of weeks. The store's owners and the employees who sold the drugs may face criminal charges. None have been filed yet.

Synthetic marijuana, sometimes referred to as K2 or spice, is one of several drugs, including plant food and bath salts, that the state now classifies as controlled substances.
