In a few states, gas is already over four dollars a gallon. Wisconsin could be next. And then higher after that. Or maybe not. Really hard to predict, says Pam Moen with the Wisconsin AAA. Gas prices don't always follow a logical progression of supply and demand. She says current prices at the pump have been affected by crude oil prices, spurred higher by unrest in the mideast. She says, if the situation in Libya expands to other parts of the mideast then we could see the upward trend in oil and gas prices continue. But, Moen says, if mideast tensions dissipate, gas prices could recede as fast as they accelerated.
