



MINNEAPOLIS (AP) From serving the hungry to building homes, volunteers in Minnesota got active in the community on Monday to honor the life and work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The InterCorps Council of Minnesota organized 16 service projects across the state on Martin Luther King Jr. Day. More than 230 people signed up to volunteer.
