

In Cashton, they batted .500 last week at the polls. A \$12.3 million referendum passed while a second question, asking voters to approve a recurring referendum for revenue of \$100 thousand to staff and maintain new building space, failed. Superintendent, Brad Saron talks about why he thinks voters snubbed their noses at that one.
