THAT'S BECAUSE OF DELAYS AT THE STATE LAB WHICH IS TESTING WOOD'S BLOOD SAMPLES FOR ALCOHOL OR DRUGS. APRIL WILL MARK SIX MONTHS SINCE WOOD WAS ARRESTED IN TOMAH. THAT WAS HIS THIRD O-W-I CHARGE IN LESS THAN A YEAR.
